





Farrowing crates.



Histories of the globally averaged normalised atmospheric concentrations of the carbon dioxide (CO₂), methane (CH₄) and nitrous oxide (N₂O) greenhouse gases over the last 2000 years. The industrial era began around 1750. Normalised concentrations are expressed as the relative mole faction, i.e., as the number of molecules of the gas in a well-mixed atmospheric sample divided by the corresponding number in 1750. The plot combines data from measurements of gas concentrations trapped in ice cores at Law Dome, Antarctica, and of directly measured marine surface annual mean data. Data for the ice cores at Law Dome were accessed from $^{[6]}$. Marine surface annual mean data were accessed from $^{[7, 8, 9]}$.
